Animals found dead on public roadways

Anyone who strikes a wild animal with a vehicle or finds one dead or injured on a public road, is asked to contact the local branch of Department of Natural Resources. These professionals can also offer advice on how to deal with nuisance animals. You will find them in the telephone book provincial blue pages under "Ranger Office".

Suspected animal neglect or abuse

Anyone who suspects an animal of being neglected or abused is encouraged to contact an NBSPCA animal protection officer or his or her local SPCA animal shelter. These notices are then given to the appropriate person for further investigation.

Members of the public reporting such cases of animal neglect are advised to note where, when, how and who took part in the incident to assist the investigation and the laying of charges where appropriate. Dated photographs and the names and contact information of other witnesses to the incident will greatly help in pursuing the investigation.

The New Brunswick Society for Prevention of Cruelty to Animals (NBSPCA) is dedicated to providing a voice for those who cannot speak for themselves.

The NBSPCA is responsible for enforcing the SPCA Act within the Province of New Brunswick. It was created March 25, 1881, with the initial goal of helping the horses working in Saint John. From livestock, our mandate quickly expanded to include companion animals until we now work to protect all domestic animals.

Our Inspectors and Animal Protection Officers responded to more than 5,000 animal cruelty calls in 2008. The NBSPCA is not government-funded. These professionals are part-time employees who rely on private donations to carry out their work.

The NBSPCA does not operate a shelter. Instead, it relies on animal shelters around to provide care in instances when animals taken into custody require help.

Eighty per cent of funds received support the NBSPCA inspection program. Eighteen per cent pays for administration costs, with the remaining monies going towards education and fund-raising.

Eighty per cent of funds for NBSPCA activities come from general donations, one-time gifts, grants and foundation bequests. The New Brunswick Animal Protection Fund, along with expense recovery from rescued animals, both contribute eight per cent of the budget. The remaining four per cent consists of miscellaneous donations and gifts made in the memories of favourite animals.

The New Brunswick SPCA is governed by a board of directors, individuals elected by the general membership at its Annual General Meeting, and appointees of the New Brunswick Provincial Government. A part-time executive director oversees day-to-day operations.

Our Network

The Kibble Pet Food Banks in New Brunswick, Canada, provide temporary relief to pet owners facing financial and other challenges. Through education, pet food and supplies, the network is designed to help owners continue to care for their animals as they work through their challenge.

This early intervention reduces the number of animals abandoned or surrendered to local shelters, providing greater security for the animals and the people who love them. Pet owners can continue to enjoy the companionship of their pets, providing emotional support in sometimes difficult situations. The animals also remain in familiar surroundings, reducing the stress they face of being displaced. Third, it also reduces the number of animals who are relinquished to shelters or are simply abandoned when their owners cannot afford to care for them.

Our network is intended to share information and resources with similar venues in the Maritimes and other parts of Canada.

- * by helping those facing financial challenges
- * providing food and supplies in times of emergency, such as house fires and flooding.

Pets with People at Risk

The Restigouche Co. SPCA provides shelter for pets just as Maison Notre Dame does for women and children. They'll look after their veterinary care and house them, all with no charge to the abused owner. As shelter manager Kathy Vautour explains it, "We'll render them safe until you are safe." It's all confidential. All the SPCA needs is a police file number. The service was used three times in 2008.

NBSPCA Equine Rescue Fund

There are an estimated 11,000 horses in New Brunswick, according to 2003 numbers from Equine Canada.

The NBSPCA averages 2-3 monthly calls regarding the welfare of large animals such as horses and cattle. It costs the NBSPCA approx. \$2,000 to take a horse into care, with factors such as travel, medical care, boarding and inspector wages.

Horse enthusiasts can now help New Brunswick horses in distress through the NBSPCA Equine Rescue Fund.

NBSPCA funds have historically been pooled to assist all animals as the need arises. Then, two ponies changed that. Spurred on by the NBSPCA's scramble to rescue the two badly malnourished animals in 2005, two Rusagonish women were determined to obtain a horse trailer for the organization. Hope Lynch and Jill Phillips quickly raised \$2,000 through a softball tournament. The NB Equestrian Association paid the balance of the cost of the trailer, and provided seed money for the newly created Equine Rescue Fund.

The welfare of New Brunswick horses has been an important part of the NBSPCA mandate since its 1881 beginning. A granite water fountain was built in Saint John's Market Square that year to provide thirsty horses with a cool drink. William Sears spearheaded what became a symbol of the commitment of New Brunswick residents to their equine partners.

The need to help New Brunswick horses remains strong more than a century later. In 2005, our group spent \$10,000 on equine rescue, addressing 120 large animal cases. The following year, the NBSPCA responded to 133 horse-related calls involving 280 animals. Unsanitary conditions, lack of shelter, or no access to food or water prompt most of the calls.

The NBSPCA educates and works with owners to address the issue, only taking horses into care when necessary. Charges are laid under the Criminal Code of Canada and the New Brunswick SPCA Act where situations warrant.

Helping these horses is a constant financial challenge. The ERF and generous volunteers like you help offset the cost of travel, inspector wages, medical care and boarding rescued animals. Please join us as we work to provide a new beginning for neglected New Brunswick horses, one animal at a time.

Dog bite prevention – Our inspectors regularly visit New Brunswick schools to help children how to act properly around dogs, helping keep pets and people safe. Geared largely to school age children, this presentation can be made to most public groups

Start a Chain Reaction – A campaign to encourage dog owners to involve their pets in family activities, and limit the time dogs spend chained outdoors. As social pack animals, dogs need the company of people and other dogs to be healthy, happy companions.

Spay/neuter for pet population control – Encouraging pet owners to have their pets spayed or neutered for health reasons and to prevent the breeding of unwanted young.

Say no to puppy mills – The newest NBSPCA campaign, we encourage potential pet owners to obtain their dogs from reputable breeders and not puppy mills, pet stores or backyard breeders. This reduces the demand for unsocialised, mass-produced, usually unhealthy dogs that often end up at animal shelters. Also, teaching the public how to recognize puppy mills helps expose and stop these operations.

Furry Fourth campaign – Encouraging pet parents to make the fourth day of each month the day to carry out regular pet chores. These might include giving monthly medications, inspecting and repairing pet equipment, a thorough grooming or other task that helps keep pets healthy and safe.

Non-insulated dog house

Kent's has a basic ready-to-assemble kit available for \$149.99 plus tax, insulation extra. Measurements are 37 inches by 41 inches by 44 inches.

Insulated dog houses

Gary Jones, of 48 Pollett River Road, (Petitcodiac, TCH highway exit 233) (506) 756-2191 or 756-4213.

His doghouses are built on a 3-foot by 5-foot insulated spruce floor, with one-inch walls. The interior dividing wall leads to a 2-foot, 10-inch by 3-foot sleeping area, that fits Labs, German Shepherds and collies. The door is 16 inches wide.

The walls and floor have 1.5 inches of insulation, and the removable roof has $\frac{3}{4}$ inch of insulation. The sleeping area is lined to prevent the dogs from chewing the insulation. There is also a small window in the back. All exterior wood is cedar, while the roof has a tarpaper and cedar shingle covering. While he doesn't put feet on his doghouses, he said customers have set them on a couple of 2x4s to get them off the ground.

He can build a doghouse in four days, occasionally having one on hand. Cost is about \$325 each.

Criminal Code of Canada as it pertains to animal cruelty

Cattle and Other Animals

Injuring or endangering cattle

444. (1) Every one commits an offence who wilfully

- wills, maims, wounds, poisons or injures cattle; or
- (b) places poison in such a position that it may easily be consumed by cattle.

Punishment

- (2) Every one who commits an offence under subsection (1) is guilty of
- an indictable offence and liable to imprisonment for a term of not more than five years; or
- (b) an offence punishable on summary conviction and liable to a fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars or to imprisonment for a term of not more than eighteen months or to both.

R.S., 1985, c. C-46, s. 444; 2008, c. 12, s. 1.

Injuring or endangering other animals

445. (1) Every one commits an offence who, wilfully and without lawful excuse,

- * kills, maims, wounds, poisons or injures dogs, birds or animals that are not cattle and are kept for a lawful purpose; or
- (b) places poison in such a position that it may easily be consumed by dogs, birds or animals that are not cattle and are kept for a lawful purpose.

Punishment

- (2) Every one who commits an offence under subsection (1) is guilty of
- an indictable offence and liable to imprisonment for a term of not more than five years; or
- (b) an offence punishable on summary conviction and liable to a fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars or to imprisonment for a term of not more than eighteen months or to both.

R.S., 1985, c. C-46, s. 445; 2008, c. 12, s. 1.

Cruelty to Animals

Causing unnecessary suffering

445.1 (1) Every one commits an offence who

- wilfully causes or, being the owner, wilfully permits to be caused unnecessary pain, suffering or injury to an animal or a bird;
- (b) in any manner encourages, aids or assists at the fighting or baiting of animals or birds; © wilfully, without reasonable excuse, administers a poisonous or an injurious drug or substance to a domestic animal or bird or an animal or a bird wild by nature that is kept in captivity or, being the owner of such an animal or a bird, wilfully permits a poisonous or an injurious drug or substance to be administered to it;

- (d) promotes, arranges, conducts, assists in, receives money for or takes part in any meeting, competition, exhibition, pastime, practice, display or event at or in the course of which captive birds are liberated by hand, trap, contrivance or any other means for the purpose of being shot when they are liberated; or
- (e) being the owner, occupier or person in charge of any premises, permits the premises or any part thereof to be used for a purpose mentioned in paragraph (d).

Punishment

- (2) Every one who commits an offence under subsection (1) is guilty of
- an indictable offence and liable to imprisonment for a term of not more than five years; or
- (b) an offence punishable on summary conviction and liable to a fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars or to imprisonment for a term of not more than eighteen months or to both.

Failure to exercise reasonable care as evidence

(3) For the purposes of proceedings under paragraph (1)(a), evidence that a person failed to exercise reasonable care or supervision of an animal or a bird thereby causing it pain, suffering or injury is, in the absence of any evidence to the contrary, proof that the pain, suffering or injury was caused or was permitted to be caused wilfully, as the case may be.

Presence at baiting as evidence

(4) For the purpose of proceedings under paragraph (1)(b), evidence that an accused was present at the fighting or baiting of animals or birds is, in the absence of any evidence to the contrary, proof that he or she encouraged, aided or assisted at the fighting or baiting. 2008, c. 12, s. 1.

Causing damage or injury

446. (1) Every one commits an offence who

- by wilful neglect causes damage or injury to animals or birds while they are being driven or conveyed; or
- (b) being the owner or the person having the custody or control of a domestic animal or a bird or an animal or a bird wild by nature that is in captivity, abandons it in distress or wilfully neglects or fails to provide suitable and adequate food, water, shelter and care for it.

Punishment

- (2) Every one who commits an offence under subsection (1) is guilty of
- an indictable offence and liable to imprisonment for a term of not more than two years; or
- (b) an offence punishable on summary conviction and liable to a fine not exceeding five thousand dollars or to imprisonment for a term of not more than six months or to both.

Failure to exercise reasonable care as evidence

(3) For the purposes of proceedings under paragraph (1)(a), evidence that a person failed to exercise reasonable care or supervision of an animal or a bird thereby causing it damage or injury is, in the absence of any evidence to the contrary, proof that the damage or injury was caused by wilful neglect.

R.S., 1985, c. C-46, s. 446; 2008, c. 12, s. 1.

Keeping cockpit

447. (1) Every one commits an offence who builds, makes, maintains or keeps a cockpit on premises that he or she owns or occupies, or allows a cockpit to be built, made, maintained or kept on such premises.

Punishment

- (2) Every one who commits an offence under subsection (1) is guilty of
- an indictable offence and liable to imprisonment for a term of not more than five years; or
- (b) an offence punishable on summary conviction and liable to a fine not exceeding ten thousand dollars or to imprisonment for a term of not more than eighteen months or to both.

Confiscation

(3) A peace officer who finds cocks in a cockpit or on premises where a cockpit is located shall seize them and take them before a justice who shall order them to be destroyed. R.S., 1985, c. C-46, s. 447; 2008, c. 12, s. 1.

Order of prohibition or restitution

- 447.1 (1) The court may, in addition to any other sentence that it may impose under subsection 444(2), 445(2), 445.1(2), 446(2) or 447(2),
- make an order prohibiting the accused from owning, having the custody or control of or residing in the same premises as an animal or a bird during any period that the court considers appropriate but, in the case of a second or subsequent offence, for a minimum of five years; and
- (b) on application of the Attorney General or on its own motion, order that the accused pay to a person or an organization that has taken care of an animal or a bird as a result of the commission of the offence the reasonable costs that the person or organization incurred in respect of the animal or bird, if the costs are readily ascertainable.

Breach of order

(2) Every one who contravenes an order made under paragraph (1)(a) is guilty of an offence punishable on summary conviction.

Application

(3) Sections 740 to 741.2 apply, with any modifications that the circumstances require, to orders made under paragraph (1)(b). 2008, c. 12, s. 1.

Animal Health Notes

Cats

A mature cat needs ¼ cup water daily when on dry food, and minimal water when on wet food. It normally getting the moisture it needs from prey (mice, birds)

Heart rate – 110 to 140 beats per minute Respiration – 20 to 30 breaths per minute Temperature -- 38.5 degrees C or 101.5 degrees F The usual cat gestation length is 63 days

Dogs

A dog drinks an ounce of water per pound of body weight daily (a puppy can drink a cup of water each day while a mature black Lab will consume half a gallon or two litres daily)

Heart – 80 beats per minute; Respiration - 15 to 20 breaths per min; Temp 38.5 degrees C or 101.5 degrees F The usual dog gestation length is 63 days A 50-pound dog requires 1,200 calories a day

Cattle

A cow needs one gallon (4 litres) of water for each 100 pounds of body weight.

Dairy (litres of water/day)

Dry Cows 40
Lactating 100
Yearling Heifers 30
Feedlot Animals 50

Beef (litres/day)

Dry Cow 35 Lactating Cow 55 Yearling Heifers 30

A mature cow on a hay-only diet eats between 30 and 40 pounds of hay a day.

Horses

A horse on a hay-only diet needs 15 gallons (60 litres) of water a day. Water should be between 5 degrees and 12 degrees to maximize water consumption.

A horse needs 1.5 - 2 per cent of its body weight in hay per day. Ie. a 1,000-pound horse will eat between 15 and 20 pounds of quality hay daily in mild weather. When temperatures drop, increase hay by 1.4 per cent for each degree below minus 5 degrees Celsius, feeding free choice to produce needed body warmth.

Heart rate – 27 to 43 beats per minute Respiration – 8 to 16 times a minute Temperature – 98 degrees F Gestation period is 11 months
