Get the right help right away!

Download your copy of our NB vet clinic / animal shelter pamphlet from our www.sPCA-nb.ca web site to find a vet office wherever you travel in New Brunswick!

Anyone who suspects an animal is being neglected or abused is encouraged to contact his or her local RCMP detachment, local NB SPCA animal shelter or an NB SPCA animal protection officer. Include as many details such as where, when, how and who took part in the incident as you can. These reports are then given to the appropriate person for further investigation.

If you strike a wild animal with a vehicle or find one dead or injured on a public road, contact the Department of Natural Resources. Find your local office in the phone book's blue pages or use the list above for quick assistance wherever you travel in the province.

Have you found a loose dog? Or has yours gone missing? Contact your local animal control officer through the municipal office. She will use the information on identification tags or microchip on licensed dogs to contact the owners to help Rover get home safely.
